

PROPOSED NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN FOR HARTLEY

In the next week or so, a leaflet will be delivered to all residents to consult about a proposal by the Parish Council to launch work on the development of a Neighbourhood Plan for Hartley.

The reasons for this will be explained in the leaflet and on the Parish Council's website but, briefly, a Neighbourhood Plan is written by the Community, the people who know and love their area, to influence future planning policies in the Parish. These Plans are supported by the Government and will have legal powers. Residents will be asked whether they support the proposal and volunteers will be encouraged to take part.

The leaflet will include a questionnaire to be returned to the Council and links to the Council's website for additional information.



CENSUS DAY-21ST MARCH 2021

The census is coming. By taking part, you can help to inform decisions on services that shape your community, such as schools, doctors' surgeries and bike lanes. It is important that you fill in your census questionnaire because the information you share affects the life of every single person living in England and Wales. Because these things matter to us all, everyone needs to complete the census.

Do not worry, your information is protected by law. That means government officials dealing with payments or services you receive cannot see it.

Census Day is Sunday 21 March. You can fill yours in online as soon as you get your access code in the post. If your household circumstances change on Census Day, you can let The Office for National Statistics (ONS) know.

Future burials will be in Manor Field Burial Ground which is situated by Manor Field Sports Pavilion, adjacent to the existing burial ground.

The interment of ashes will still be permitted in the NEW garden of remembrance but the OLD garden of remembrance is now closed.

HARTLEY WALKS

The following information has been kindly provided by Jackie Rye who, under normal Circumstances, organises the weekly walk from Hartley Library. There are 17 walks so far and they cover virtually every footpath starting from Hartley Library. (More may be added over time).

The walks are stored on DropBox which is a free Microsoft service. You do <u>not</u> have to be signed up to DropBox to be able to view the walks which are in the form of PDF files.

You can also access them on your mobile phone and you can, if you wish, download the DropBox App to improve that.

To get to them you will need to do the following:

• That will bring up a list of the walks for you to look at.

• Click on any walk to have a look at it and if you want to do it just print it off for yourself otherwise click on other walks to find one you like.

• If you do not have a printer, once you have chosen your walk either copy the PDF and insert it into an e mail to someone who does or just forward this e mail to them and tell them which walk you want printed - they are numbered 1 to 17.

 To get into the website at another time you either need to keep this e mail and follow point 1 above or, when you first get into the website, save it as a 'Favourite' on your PC which will make it easier.

• If necessary, due for instance to diversion of paths, the directions will be revised so it is best to go to the website each time you want to do a walk so you have the most up to date information.

INCONSIDERATE PARKING

The Parish Council has received a number of complaints regarding parking on the pavements. Vehicles parked on pavements can cause particular problems for people in wheelchairs or with visual impairments and those with pushchairs. MESSAGE FROM JACKIE WEST, OUR COMMUNITY WARDEN:

I am sometimes approached by community members who ask for scam advice and support.

Please see some general advice that I hope may help.

Remember these ten golden rules to help you prevent fraud and beat the scammers.

- 1. Be suspicious of all 'too good to be true' offers and deals. There are no guaranteed get-rich-quick schemes.
- 2. Don't agree to offers or deals immediately. Insist on time to get independent or legal advice before making a decision.
- 3. Don't hand over money or sign anything until you've checked someone's credentials and their company's.
- 4. Never send money to anyone you don't know or trust, whether in the UK or abroad, or use methods of payment you're not comfortable with.
- 5. Never give banking or personal details to anyone you don't know or trust. This information is valuable so make sure you protect it.
- 6. Always log on to a website directly rather than clicking on links in an email.
- 7. Don't just rely on glowing testimonials. Find solid, independent evidence of a company's success.
- 8. Always get independent or legal advice if an offer involves money, time or commitment.
- 9. If you spot a scam or have been scammed, report it and get help.
- 10. Don't be embarrassed about reporting a scam. Because the scammers are cunning and clever there's no shame in being deceived. By reporting it, you'll make it more difficult for them to deceive others.

If you think you have uncovered a scam, been targeted by a scam, or fallen victim to fraudsters, contact Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040.

Call 101 if you know the suspect or they are still in the area.

Reporting crime, including fraud, is important.

Your information may form part of one big jigsaw and be vital in completing the picture.

THE COUNTRYSIDE CODE
