#### **Neighbourhood Plan**

Four years ago the Parish Council created a Steering Group consisting of nine resident volunteers, and four Parish Councillors, to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan for Hartley. The purpose of the Plan was to establish what the Parish should look like over the next fifteen years.

The process for creating the Plan is quite complex and includes gathering evidence from residents through consultations and developing the results into workable policies, to guide planning decisions in the future. The basic policies, supported by residents, include the retention of the open countryside, and woodlands in the Green Belt around the Village, maintaining local green spaces, producing design codes for any new buildings, retention of Community Assets and supporting local businesses.

The Steering Group recently received a boost with the service, for 20 days, of a Planning Consultant's time to help with the remaining technical issues. (This cost was met by a Government Grant). This has enabled the Steering Group to make progress and, it is anticipated, that the next major stage will be in the Autumn with the submission of a draft Plan to Sevenoaks District Council. (The Council must be consulted to ensure that the Plan meets certain statutory requirements).

A formal consultation with residents, on the Plan, will take place early next year and it is hoped that the Community will support the work so far undertaken. If you live in, or have moved to Hartley to enjoy the countryside, this will be your opportunity to protect it.

#### **Anti-Social Motorbike Activity**

Residents are reminded that the riding of motorbikes/mini motorbikes and similar vehicles is **NOT** permitted on any of the Council's open spaces, which include Woodland Avenue, Chantry Avenue and Longfield Hill playgrounds, Hartley Wood, Gorse Wood, Rectory Meadow, Manor Field, Billings Hill Shaw and Northfield.

The riding of the above vehicles in any of these areas is classed as antisocial behaviour.


