Northfield projects

The Northfield Management Committee agreed that coppicing will take place within the ancient woodlands within Northfield. This project has already started and will continue over the next few years.

What is coppicing?

Coppicing is a traditional woodland management technique that dates to the Stone Age. It involves felling trees at their base to create a 'stool' where new shoots will grow.

You can recognise a coppiced tree by the many thin trunks or 'poles' at its base. Most tree species can be coppiced but the best suited of our native trees are Hazel, Hornbeam, Ash and Lime.

What's it for?

Coppicing was originally used to ensure a regular source of firewood and timber. Traditionally, the long straight poles produced by coppicing would have been used for fencing, building and in the garden as bean poles.

These days, coppicing is primarily a way of improving the health and biodiversity of a woodland area by opening it up to the sunlight and allowing a wider range of plants to flourish.

Tree Planting

Kent Plan Trees, in association with Kent County Council, have planted 2,500 trees with assistance from Corporate Works Days, the New Ash Green Woodlands Group and residents.

Antisocial Motorbike Activity

Residents are reminded that the riding of motorbikes/mini motorbikes and similar vehicles is not permitted on any of the Council's open spaces, which include Woodland Avenue, Chantry Avenue and Longfield Hill playgrounds, Hartley Wood, Gorse Wood, Rectory Meadow, Billings Hill Shaw and Northfield.

The riding of the above vehicles in any of these areas is classed as anti-social behaviour. If you see anyone riding these vehicles illegally you can report it to the police using either


