Hartley Burial Grounds

Hartley Parish Council manages Hartley Burial Ground, Manor Field Burial Ground and the Closed Church Yard.

As such, the Parish Council has a duty of care to assess and manage the risks imposed by memorials in these areas.

The inspection and testing of all memorials has now been completed and grave owners will be contacted if any memorials are highlighted in the report.

Kent Community Warden Service Review

The financial challenges faced by Kent County Council mean that they are having to consider savings across a whole range of services. Their wardens work with communities and partners in lots of different ways - from supporting scam victims, helping communities affected by flooding, reducing social isolation and loneliness and helping residents to navigate care and support services.

To make savings, they are proposing to:

- Redesign the service, ensuring there is a core Community Warden presence across the county, with teams covering two districts
- Retain the remit and community-based way the service currently works but cover fewer communities
- Use data and information to identify where to place wardens for most impact.

Development of Hartley's Neighbourhood Plan

On behalf of the Parish Council, the Neighbourhood Plan is being developed by a Steering Group consisting of some Councillors and local residents who want to support and defend the Parish for the future.

Early consultation with residents has shown a desire to keep the Green Belt intact to preserve access to the countryside for walking and pleasure, the need for a mix of housing and preservation of historic buildings.

With these in mind the Steering Group has been securing evidence to underpin policies which, if supported and approved by residents, will provide a legal basis for future planning in our Village. This evidence has largely been produced by professional consultants and the costs have been met by Government Funds made available for Neighbourhood Plans. All the support work undertaken by Members of the Steering Group has been entirely voluntary.

A further consultation will be undertaken in the Autumn with a questionnaire being delivered, by hand, to every household in the Parish.

It is vital that everyone who loves living in Hartley and wants it to remain unspoilt, completes the questionnaire and returns it to the Parish Office in the Library.
